

Dear Friends

I sit at my desk writing this article ahead of the busy Christmas period and anticipating what it might look like when readers view it in February 2021. So just a reminder at this point we look as though we are heading for a no deal Brexit – or is it last minute brinkmanship to get the best possible deal? And the first vaccines for front line workers and the most vulnerable are being administered.

My theme then is hope, one of the three great theological virtues of which St Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 13 – faith, hope and love. Of these probably hope is the most easily forgotten or overlooked. Indeed the word has become rather diluted to a sometimes vague aspiration – when someone says: 'I'm hoping to make it' or 'I hope to be there on time' it nearly always sounds like someone getting their excuses in early, and reassuring you that whilst the heart is willing the flesh is nowhere to be seen.

What then of these two 'hopes' – Brexit and an effective Vaccine? One of these I would contend, is far more like the biblical use of the word 'hope' than the other. Whatever we might individually 'hope' for in Brexit – and I realise that differs significantly – no one is sure they are going to get what they hope for. It's on a knife edge, and given different people want different things – a large proportion of people are going to be disappointed whatever the outcome – we just don't know which proportion it is yet. That is not like biblical hope.

The hope of the vaccine is however rather different. I might have to eat my words I suppose, but the vaccine does seem to promise the end of the present health crisis. We all know it will



take months to roll out, and that in the meantime we will have to be patient, abide by the restrictions and prepare for bad outcomes. But we can clearly see the light at the end of the tunnel and that light is not a vague aspiration or mirage — we can see it being administered day by day.

That is much more like the biblical use of the word hope – in the bible hope is something which God has promised, but which has not yet arrived. However because God has promised it, it is certain that it will come. We aren't there yet, but God promises a kingdom of righteousness and justice, a city where tears and sadness, suffering and death will be no more. And it is in that sense in which I wish you a hopeful new year.

An update on Welwyn St Mary's FC has not been sent to the magazine since the the 2019/20 football season was curtailed back in March. In line with regulations, St Mary's returned gradually to training in the summer and the squad has been strengthened with several new additions.

So far it has been a stop-start season. St Mary's has played four pre-season fixtures against opposition from the county leagues and have had several fixtures postponed. We entered the Christmas break in third place in the league with two wins and two draws, just two points off the top with two games in hand. The most recent match to be played was on 12th December when Welwyn beat FC Cornerstone of Stevenage 3-2. The new signings contributed well with Matt Wren taking on the entire Cornerstone defence to pull back the bell for the captain Tom Reason to finish well. Cornerstone struck back just before half time. However Welwyn went ahead again with a sublime chip from James Stevens and then a second for Tom Reason, this time from the penalty spot. The penalty occurred after new signing Dammy Oluwadamilola had been bundled to the ground. Robbie Oldham almost broke the crossbar with a thunderous drive to nearly make it 4-1. The opposition almost snatched a point by scoring with five minutes remaining and then almost equalising with the final phase of the game as our 'keeper Brad Cook blocked a point-blank header with his feet.

New OWL members

In our last article before Christmas, we reported that 2020 had seen a further increase in members registered with OWL to receive alerts about scams and crime in our neighbourhood. If you're not yet registered but received a smartphone, tablet or even a new desktop computer for Christmas, please consider joining Neighbourhood Watch now using the link at the bottom of the page.

As well as writing for the Welwyn Magazine, we include articles in the quarterly Welwyn News, distributed to every household in Welwyn. In the Winter 2020 edition, we appealed for new members to come forward in Clockhouse Gardens, Windsor Road, Harmer Green Lane and New Road where members were thin on the ground. Our appeal drew a few positive responses, but more would be very welcome. Do you know anyone who lives in these roads or apartments? Whilst maintaining social distancing, could you ask if they know about Neighbourhood Watch?

As to the other areas of Welwyn, it's quite likely that your neighbour next door or opposite is not yet a member. Could you do them a favour and invite them to join? Since the pandemic hit us and we began taking more care to look out for one another, lots of WhatsApp groups have sprung up covering roads or areas. If you belong to one, could you post an example OWL message for your neighbours to see? Or maybe you're in touch with local friends and contacts who share other interests such as tennis or walking, and might perhaps be interested in Neighbourhood Watch too?

Before the pandemic hit us last year, it had been the practice for the police to periodically canvass whole roads in Welwyn Hatfield, knocking on every door to encourage residents to sign up for OWL messages. That helped us to grow to the 47% coverage we now have in Welwyn. We don't know when it might be possible for the local police to resume their visits. In the meantime, it's up to us – and you – to spread the word that the more people receiving Neighbourhood Watch OWL messages, the safer we all are.





NOVEMBER PCC MEETING

The PCC met, or perhaps we should say convened since this meeting took place entirely over Zoom, on Monday evening the 16th of November, efficiently chaired by the Rector, David Munchin, .

The following were appointed;

New treasurer – Maggie Varco,

New secretary – Louise Hughes,

New safeguarding officer - Vicky Jenkin

New person responsible for Fabric - Stuart Jenkin

Continuing in post as vice-chairman - Sue Keach.

In addition the three lay leaders of worship – Jo Fozzard, Wendy Lawrence and Joy Hanratty have kindly agreed to continue in post.

More difficult to fill is the acutely felt vacancy left by the departure of Dominic Holroyd-Thomas. The formalities involved in appointing a new curate mean that it is unlikely that a replacement will be appointed earlier than mid-summer 2022.

The outgoing treasurer, Don Bell, reported on the state of the finances. In this year of need the finances have been greatly helped by a generous gift and a legacy to St Mary's.

Mr Bell had also been investigating suppliers of 'green' energy (electric power). He had concluded that it came down to a straight choice between EON and Octopus Energy. There is very little or no difference between their offers. The meeting agreed to leave it to Mr Bell to enter into a supply contract for St Mary's with one or the other of them

As a result of far fewer or none of the congregation being able to attend church in person and make a contribution to St Mary's during the offertory hymn, many have taken to donating online via the St Mary's Virgin Money Giving page using a debit or credit card and as a result donations online have increased appreciably.

In addition to this and for the benefit of those who are able to attend St Mary's, now and in future, but may not care to donate via Virgin Money, Maggie Varco is investigating the possibility of placing a contactless card payment terminal in church to make it easier to donate without the need for cash.

Otherwise there were two main topics considered by the meeting; the ongoing matter of replacing the old heating boiler, which is proving less than straightforward. It was under discussion at the July 2020 PCC at which time it was

hoped to have the replacement up and running in time for this winter but that has not been possible for a number of reasons, some foreseen, others not. The project continues but now one company will handle the removal of the existing boiler, another, the re-lining of the flue and a third the installation of a new boiler. Meanwhile it was also decided to have the inoperative ground source heat pumps overhauled and brought back to serviceable condition.

Hopefully, once those projects are completed we should have a warm and cosy church once more.

The Rector mentioned that plans were in place for the Christmas services to accommodate the various possibilities that the Covid-19 regulations prevailing at Christmas time might necessitate.

The other matter under review is the possibility of upgrading the audio-visual equipment used for live-streaming the church services via YouTube and other media. The Rector is receiving advice and assistance from two local companies. Of course, any new equipment bought or hired will have a cost. Those who rely on the broadcast services would appreciate the improvement in audio quality.

Other diseases like measles and diphtheria have been reduced by up to 99.9% since their vaccines were introduced.

However, if people stop having vaccines, it's possible for infectious diseases to quickly spread again as the number of unvaccinated people increases. Measles is increasing in groups where vaccination levels have fallen.

Vaccines:

Protect you from many serious and potentially deadly diseases.

Protect other people in your community – by helping to stop diseases spreading to people who cannot have vaccines.

Get thoroughly safety tested before being introduced – they're also monitored for any side effects.

Sometimes cause mild side effects that will not last long.

Reduce or even get rid of some diseases – if enough people are vaccinated Vaccines:

Do not cause autism – studies have found no evidence of a link between the MMR vaccine and autism

Do not overload or weaken the immune system.

Do not cause allergies or any other conditions – all the current evidence tells us that vaccinating is safer than not vaccinating

Do not contain mercury (Thiomersal)

Do not contain any ingredients that cause harm in such small amounts – but speak to your doctor if you have any known allergies such as eggs or gelatine

The World Health Organization (WHO) recently listed vaccine hesitancy as one of their top 10 biggest threats to global health.

DANESBURY FERNERY

"THE BEST TO BE FOUND IN THE HOME COUNTIES"

In 1859, William John Blake commissioned James Pulham and Son of Broxbourne to construct a fernery in an old chalk pit at Danesbury. Once built, the new fernery was planted by the head gardener Anthony Parsons and maintained alongside ornamental gardens, a palm house, walled gardens and extensive parkland. The grounds were well planted, as shown by the two watercolours reproduced here. The one below depicts the view from the house towards where Welwyn Garden City is today. Both watercolours were painted by William's daughter Fanny Blake.





There is no doubting the continuing success of the Danesbury Fernery, which reflects the immense amount of work and dedication put in by a team of hardworking volunteer gardeners. The volunteers wish to express their appreciation for the many favourable and encouraging comments they receive from the numerous visitors to the Fernery.

As the days lengthen and we can think positively to the joys of spring, please make sure you visit the Fernery which has been restored over the past five years by volunteers in partnership with the Borough Council. You will not fail to notice the massive changes that the volunteers have achieved

In October 2020 the volunteers completed a further phase of planting many thousands of bulbs, which has been gathering pace over the past few years.

We planted vast numbers of iris Reticulata Pixie, crocus Tomassinianus, and more daffodil varieties including 'February Gold', 'Tête à Tête' and 'Golden Bells'.

Additionally, we have planted huge numbers of white wild daffodils, - Pseudonarcissus Lent Lily narcissus, that will easily be viewed from the field, which will hopefully draw passing walkers into visiting the Fernery.

The October 2020 bulb planting adds to the numerous snowdrops, Blue Crocus, Winter Aconites, Narcissus, Blue Cammasias and delicate pink cyclamens, that were planted in previous years.

This bulb planting will hopefully bring the Fernery back to life and raise our spirits after a long and difficult winter with a fabulous display.

Meanwhile, we have also continued to plant many more varieties of ferns, and where possible these reflect the ferns likely to have been originally planted.

Those readers who have not visited the Fernery recently will see that many changes have taken place during 2020.





These include:-

The installation of a rustic bridge over the gorge, replacing an original long lost bridge, together with some lovely new planting on the north bank.

A grill over the dropping well water tank, so visitors can marvel at its Victorian brick barrel roof construction, together with some surrounding protective Victorian wrought iron fencing.

Restoration of the dropping well, so that on open days, water will be turned on for visitors to enjoy.

Reinstatement of the missing pieces of Victorian estate fence panels and the entrance gate into the Fernery, thus creating an 'air of antiquity' as visitors enter the Fernery. The fence panels and gate have been kindly donated by a near neighbour, Dennis Goldsmith.



Provision of an Information Board, which is located beside the middle kissing gate entrance to the field off Digswell Park Road - the bumpy road. The Information Board will provide visitors with a brief historical background to the Fernery, together with an overview of the recovery work and restoration plus the subsequent planting of ferns, wild flowers and Victorian themed plants. (See Magazine front cover)

In the Spring of 2021 the volunteers hope to purchase a second garden bench out of donations received. This will be sited on the south bank to complement the existing bench on the north bank.

The Friends of Danesbury Fernery gratefully acknowledge the continuing support they receive from Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council, and particularly for allocating funds received from the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government for the purchase of the rustic bridge, the dropping well grill and the information board.

Sorry not to be more definite on nuts and bolts, but I hope you will understand why, and please do join in – details can always be found on our church's website and Facebook pages.



ONLINE MEN'S BREAKFAST - October 2020

<u>"Satellites for Seafarers"</u> Philip Molloy



The Men's Breakfast continues on-line. Thirty four gentlemen joined the Zoom talk, after their breakfast, to hear a talk by Philip Molloy, to give him his full title BSc Mech Eng. (London). Member BIS. College Lecturer formally of Rolls Royce Aero Engines. He moved on to become a 'Rocket Scientist' working for 38 years in the UK spacecraft industry. He has worked on communications, environmental, scientific, interplanetary and military spacecraft. Before he retired to do lecturing, he was Chief Engineer on a \$1.5bn space program for the UK MOD. He is one of the most eminent rocket and satellite scientists in the UK and in Europe.

The story of maritime satellites begins with the formation of ESA, the European Space Agency. In 1975 it started building the first of two satellites. Marecs A was built at BAE in Stevenage. It was completed in 1980 and launched successfully by an Ariane French rocket to cover shipping in the Atlantic. This rocket travelled at 7,000mph and consumed 5 tons of fuel per second!

Construction then began on a more advanced satellite Marecs B to cover the Pacific Ocean. It was completed in 1982 and launched in 1982 from French Guyana. Unfortunately, the Ariane rocket exploded scattering parts of the satellite over West Africa. Unbelievably, some components were recovered and were reused together with some spare and some new parts. The third satellite was not named Marecs C but Marecs B2 to embarrass the Ariane rocket builders! It was launched successfully in 1984.

ONLINE MEN'S BREAKFAST - October 2020

The Marecs satellites had 60 channels and one emergency channel. It soon became clear that there was a huge demand from shipping, which needed to be met. So the next generation of satellites was provided by INMARSAT a commercial company based in London. Four were launched between 1990 and 1992 to cover all the oceans. They will last between 10 and 15 years. The programme has continued with INMARSATs 3,4,5 and 6. Thirteen satellites are currently in orbit. 40,000 ships are connected to its system and 9 out of 10 aeroplanes feedback technical information on each flight.

Phillip has given this talk on cruise ships and on one occasion a lady approached him with tears in her eyes and introduced her husband whose life had been saved after his yacht was wrecked by a storm in the Caribbean. He had pressed the button on his transponder on the emergency



channel and he was picked up by the nearest vessel which was an oil tanker.

Satellite Construction in Stevenage

During questions he was asked about the UK having to leave the Galileo project as a result of Brexit. It has had a troubled history in its bid to create a European GPS system to provide an alternative to the American military owned GPS. After years of bickering between the countries, the project was started by Surrey Satellites, a small company based in Guilford, now owned by Airbus. There are now 5 satellites in orbit but 20 to 25 are needed for complete global coverage. ESA is separate from the EU so the decision to exclude the UK is entirely political, but it may also be due to the UK losing its lead due to a lack of government backing. France, Germany, Italy and other EU countries currently invest ten times more than the UK government. The future of companies such as Astrium in Stevenage, now foreign owned, are in doubt. The UK stands to lose £12bn a year in exports and thousands of jobs.

Philip must be glad that he is now retired! His talk was one of our new series of on-line get togethers. The next will be in late January. We are hoping that 2021 will see us resume our breakfasts in Church House.

I would like to start by wishing you all a peaceful, healthy, safe and happy 2021.

As I am writing this on New Year's Day I can't know what the next 12 months will bring but I am hoping that we will all be able to get some normality back into our lives.

The Parish Council, like many individuals, businesses and organisations has suffered financially due to the pandemic. Loss of hiring revenue from our facilities is impacting this fiscal year's performance and the continuing uncertainty makes forward planning difficult. Nevertheless, we are optimistic that this will change, enabling us to move forward with our Action Plan for the benefit of all our Parish residents.

Climate Emergency:- We will be talking to residents and businesses about how we can all contribute to making our Parish more environmentally friendly. It should take about an hour to complete and provide intellectual stimulus during Covid Lockdown and a great excuse to enjoy a mug of good coffee with your soul-mate!

There is no hidden agenda; the Parish Council want to know YOUR preferences, opinions and ideas. Post-Covid, we will organise public meetings and focus groups to discuss the Plan content, but we first need your views to give us somewhere to start.

The Plan is a vision for the future and will help us formulate and establish policy that residents have had a major hand in shaping. It cannot challenge the overall number of dwellings which the Borough's Local Plan specifies but it does give the community a say in defining the look and feel of new developments and the type of housing required, to make it more acceptable for the community at large. It also enables us to identify key strategic issues and solutions facing us: e.g. traffic, environmental, sustainable living; how we want our green spaces and leisure facilities to develop and our commercial centres and employment. It will help prioritise the use of our share of the Community Infrastructure Levy (charged on new developments to help improve local infrastructure). It will help prevent speculative development and is being developed with sustainability and the Climate Emergency at its heart.

The survey was funded by a central government grant. Completed forms may be posted back (using the envelope provided) to the Parish Council, or dropped in the letter box at our offices in Lockleys Drive, or left in a box outside the Civic Centre in Prospect Place (during opening hours). We have asked for responses by 8 February, but a good response is more important than the timely return of only a few. We want the results to be properly representative, so please tell us what you think and shape the future of our Parish for the next 15-20 years.

NEWS FROM AYOT ST PETER



Agnes Bonham - a Victorian sculptress

Visitors to our church are often surprised to learn that the beautiful Caen stone pulpit was the work of a lady sculptor. Agnes Bonham completed a number of large works for churches, but

remains a relatively unknown artist. She never mentioned her work in any census return, simply listing "of independent means" - but she was not a lady of leisure!

Agnes was the youngest of six children of the Revd. John Bonham and his wife Barbarina (née Norris) who married in 1827. Revd. Bonham inherited Ballintaggart estate, Co Kildare, from his father, another John Bonham. Barbarina's father was John Norris Esq, of Hughenden Manor, Buckinghamshire (later the


home of Benjamin Disraeli and now a National Trust property).

Revd. Bonham was curate at Dunsby parish in Lincolnshire. The couple's first two children - Margaret Louisa and Mary - were born there. Around 1830 the family relocated to Ireland, and a further four children arrived – Francis, Anne Blanche, John and lastly Agnes Jane Susan born in 1837.

By 1861 the family were living in Cheltenham. John - now retired - was listed on the census as a clergyman "without the cure of souls".

The timing of some of Agnes' work is unclear, but her sculptures at St Margaret's Church, Whitnash (Warwickshire) are dated as 1862 (a pulpit plus other carvings in the chancel). The book "A history and description of the parish of Whitnash" by James Reynolds Young (1865) features a lengthy description of the beauty of the new pulpit, but the artist is not named. Agnes is mentioned only as "a young lady, a friend of the Rector's."

A newspaper article in "The Queen" dated 16 June 1888 stated that Agnes studied at "South Kensington, the Royal Academy and afterwards in Rome".

Agnes enrolled at the Royal Academy of Arts in 1870. Her profession was "sculpture" and the address was 24 Ovington Square, Chelsea. At 33 years, Agnes was at least a decade older than the other students, but she was already an accomplished sculptress.

Agnes's father died in 1875, the same year that the pulpit was installed at Ayot St Peter. In 1878 Agnes completed a carved pulpit of Caen stone for Bangor Cathedral, designed by Gilbert Scott.

By the time of the 1881 census Agnes was living with her mother at 'Hillside', South Norwood Hill. Barbarina died in 1882, and later Agnes moved into 9 Cypress Road, South Norwood, which was her final home.

Agnes was a member of St John the Evangelist church in Norwood and completed a reredos (a large decoration behind the altar) for them in 1888. "The Queen" states that Queen Victoria had "graciously accepted" a photograph of the work. Also in 1888 Agnes started on a reredos for Holy Trinity Church, New Westminster (British Columbia).

Agnes died on 7 October 1906 aged 69, and was buried in Hughenden on 10 October. A plaque in St John's records the gratitude of the congregation for her service to the church.
